
Latest meeting

The latest meeting of the Redditch Local History Society was held on Monday 11th November 2019 at the Oasis Christian Centre, Plymouth Road

For the meeting we had an attendance of 28 members and 3 visitors, giving a total of 31 attendees. The meeting was opened by the Chairman who welcomed members and visitors.

Presentation

Our presentation today was entitled 'The Paolozzi Mosaics' and was given by Philip Roberts. However, the title was misleading, as Philip gave a wide ranging talk covering the evolution of Eduardo Paolozzi as a major artist, the explosion of post war civic art, how the Milward Square mosaics were conceived and the techniques used in the manufacture.

Eduardo Paolozzi was born Edinburgh in 1924, to Italian parents. His early life was traumatic as in 1940, aged 16, he was interned for 3 months as an enemy alien, his family confectionery business was looted and his father and grandfather drowned at sea on the way to Canada when the SS Arandora Star was sunk by a German U-Boat. However, in 1942 he enrolled at Edinburgh School of Art which awakened his interest in modern art. This was followed by post war periods at the Ruskin School of Art and the Slade School of Art. From 1947-49 he was in Paris and became part of the artistic community where he worked in collage and colour. In the 1950's and 60's he collaborated with Peter Blake and Richard Hamilton, and was teaching in London, Hamburg and California. In 1979 he becomes a Royal Academician and in 1989 he was knighted.

The Redditch Mosaics commissioning and funding was essentially the initiative of the Redditch Development Corporation and the Chairman, Professor Denys Hinton (Architect). However, it was also supported by the Needle Industries Group, the Worshipful Company of Needle makers and the Arts Council of Great Britain. The total cost was £125,000. The design concept was created by Paolozzi drawing and refining motifs and symbols related to that important part of Redditch history, the Needle Industry.

Paolozzi's design was interpreted and produced using glass mosaic pieces by internationally recognised craftsmen from Spilimbergo, Italy.

There are 12 Mosaic panels, each 6.5 metres wide by 3.5 metres deep producing a total of 288 square metres.

Commissioned in 1981, and formally unveiled in 1983. Milward Square was officially opened during the Queen's Visit to Redditch on the 5th July 1983.

This is a very brief overview of a very extensive and informative presentation which was much appreciated by the audience.
